

## **BYE-LAWS 4**

### **CHILDREN**

In exercise of the powers conferred under Rule 16(b) of the Constitution, the Council makes the following Bye-Laws relative to children:-

1. Fellows and spouses MUST exercise sufficient supervision over their young children or any other accompanying children whilst such children are in the House.
2. Children under 21 years of age using any of the facilities of the House must be accompanied by an adult member who shall maintain constant supervision and control over the children. The Society reserves the right to refuse entry to unaccompanied children. Members shall be fully responsible for the conduct and behaviour of their children and any other accompanying children visiting the House in their charge and will be liable to the Society in respect of any damage or injury caused by the child or children and will keep the Council and the Society fully indemnified in respect of any action, claim and demand arising by reason of such child or children's act or default.
3. In principle, children under 12 years of age are discouraged from utilising Society facilities after 10.00 p.m. However, on designated family occasions, this requirement will be waived.

UNRULY CHILDREN - At the discretion of any Council Member or House and Grounds Staff, any member or spouse may be requested to remove such unruly children from the premises.

4. Children under 18 years of age are prohibited from entering the bar and darts area.
5. Children may use the Library accompanied by a parent who shall be responsible for any book selection by them.
6. Under no circumstances shall children be permitted to reprimand any of the Society's staff.
7. Children using the playground equipment do so at their own and their parent's risk.
8. Children are prohibited from bringing guests to the House.
9. Children are not permitted to sign chits for food and beverages consumed by them.
10. These Bye-Laws shall also apply to children accompanying parents staying in the accommodation at the Society.
